





Artists Biographies:

Whitney Bedford currently lives and works in Los Angeles. She has been included in group exhibitions at the Jewish Museum, New York; Massachusetts Museum of Contemporary Art, North Adams; and the Museum of Contemporary Art, Denver. Bedford's work is included in the Jumex Collection, Mexico City, Mexico; the De La Cruz Collection, Miami, Florida, USA; The Saatchi Collection, London, England; the Francois Pinault Collection, Paris, France; the Eric Decelle Collection, Brussels, Belgium; the Collection Ginette Moulin/Guillaume Houze, Paris, France; and Marciano Foundation in Los Angeles. She received her MFA from the University of California, Los Angeles in 2003.

Stephen Eichhorn (b. 1984, United States) lives and works in Chicago. He has had solo exhibitions at the Franklin Park Conservatory, Elmhurst Art Museum, and the Chicago Athletic Association. His work has also been included in group exhibitions at the Tower Hill Botanic Gardens, the Ukrainian Institute of Modern Art, NEIU Fine Arts Center Gallery, Illinois State Musem Lockport Gallery and the Museum of Arts and Design, New York. Stephen Eichhorn is represented by Carrie Secrist Gallery.

Andrew Holmquist (b. 1985, United States) lives and works in Berlin, Germany. His exhibition history includes four solo presentations with the Carrie Secrist Gallery. Upcoming shows include a group exhibition at the National Museum of Ceramics in Paris. Holmquist was recently featured in the exhibition *Eternal Youth* at the Museum of Contemporary Art, Chicago in March of 2017 and A Strong Desire at PS120 in Berlin, 2018. He is an MFA graduate of the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.

Anne Lindberg (b. 1962, United States) lives and works in New York. In October of 2018 Lindberg will have her first solo exhibition in New York City at the Museum of Art and Design. In 2016 she presented a solo exhibition at Art Omi in New York. Her site-specific work is on view in Landscape abstracted at the Museum of Fine Arts Boston through 2017. Recent exhibitions include Thomas Cole Historical National Historic Site in upstate NY, CAM Raleigh, NC, The Mattress Factory in Pittsburgh, Contemporary Arts Center Cincinnati, OH; Atlanta Contemporary Art Center, GA; US Embassy, Rangoon, Burma; Bemis Center for Contemporary Arts, Omaha, NE; Nerman Museum of Contemporary Art, Overland Park, KS; and Bom Retiro Cultural Center, Sao Paulo, Brazil. Accolades include a Joan Mitchell Foundation Grant (2011) and the Art Omi International Artists Residency (2009); Lindberg's work may be found in public and private collections worldwide.

Liliana Porter (b. Argentina, 1941, resides in New York since 1964) works across mediums with printmaking, painting, drawing, photography, video, installation, theater, and public art. Porter currently has a solo exhibition at El Museo del Barrio (2018). Recent solo shows include those at The Perez Art Museum in Miami; ART OMI in Ghent, NY; Savannah College of Art and Design in Savannah, GA; El Museo Nacional de Artes Visuales in Montevideo; Museo Provincial de Bellas Artes, Argentina; and Museo de Arte de Zapopan in Guadalajara, Mexico. Her work is featured in the traveling exhibition Radical Women: Latin American Art, 1960 – 1985 at the Brooklyn Museum, NY and the Hammer in Los Angeles, CA. In 2017 Porter's work was included in Viva Arte Viva, La Biennale di Venezia, 57th International Art Exhibition in Italy and she debuted Domar al leon y otras dudas, her third theatrical production in June at the 2nd Bienal de Performance, Parque de la Memoria in Buenos Aires, Argentina.
